We also celebrated Halloween, where students participated in different activities/crafts within our Spirit Houses.

In an effort to learn more about the traditional land we are fortunate to work, learn and play on, our Spirit Houses now associate their respective colours with some new identities that are land related. They are: Blue/Water, Yellow/Sun, Green/Land, and Red/Heart. We look forward to learning more about our new identities over the rest of the year!

We continue to reflect on the core competencies during our weekly assemblies and have reflected on the concepts of: building relationships, caring for the community and environment, resolving problems, valuing diversity, understanding relationships and cultural contexts, and recognizing personal values and choices. To date, two class led assemblies have shared their reflections, and I am looking forward to working with the Kiwanis Terrific Kid Program to recognize how this learning is benefiting our community, making each student a terrific kid.
