### 1. Reports from Executive (20 min):

President Report (Taylor Coelho):

- Grade 5 meet & greet with the other elementary schools circle back to work with HS Grenda/PGE/DRE to host at the high school gym to help get all 3 schools together prior to school ending. Taylor to follow-up with PAC presidents.
- Casual day Wear what you want Wednesday look at bringing in casual clothing day. Robbie to talk with staff, look at adding 1 day a month.

### Vice President Report (Victoria Thew):

• Robbie is sending out a letter from the PAC to Grade 4 families tomorrow with details for an online meeting on Feb 26 to discuss pre grad fundraising needs. We have approx. 35 students going into Grade 5 in the Fall. Hoodies quote is approx. \$2205 & Gardom Lake approx. \$10,500. Look at having Grade 4 come do Spring bottle drive if not needed for the Grade 5s trip this year. Robbie to contact Grade 5 parents to give each of them an update on what fees are left owing & to see how they plan to pay.

# Secretary Report (Melanie Anaka): absent

- Reviewed Treasurer report report attached.
- Gaming account balance \$5,983.31
- Winter Basket raffle revenue has been reported to the gaming authority.
- PAC investment into GIC, checked in with COPAC and we are allowed to make investments. Compared cashable long-term vs non-redeemable short term. Michelle to find out if a banker can attend to do a presentation and answer any questions, prior to us sending out the 30-day notice of the online meeting with the school community.

# 2. Principal Report (10 min): (Mr. Robbie Franklin):

- School calendar changes for September 1 more min of learning added, 853 hours kindergarten, 878 hours grade 1-5 of school. This is why we see gradual entry for kindergarten.
- School community learning plan: showcase to the Superintendent/SD 23 where we are with school learning plan, our goals will take place on April 29 at 12:30pm.
- Assemblies we have done at the school this year Greg Kennedy (swimmer), Coralee (Indigenous artist), Kutapira (drummers), Kelly Haines (Ventriloquist) coming in May. Principal assembly to focus on our school themes/goals. Averages out to 2-3 assemblies per student each month.
- Numbers for the Fall we are projecting to be at full capacity with minimal adjustment room
- Mrs. Easton will be going on mat leave around June.
- Cleaning & re-organizing the spaces around the school to purge and make space for storage.
- Moving used uniforms into bins for future storage rather than storing them on the shelves. PAC to hold another used uniform buy & swap during the next bottle drive.
- \$6503.75 + \$500 for bussing for Gardom Lake
- This year approx. around October will be getting surgery and will be off for up to 3-months for recovery.

#### 3. Standing Committee Reports (5 min each):

**COPAC** (Victoria Thew):

- The district is currently at 108% capacity and still growing by approx. 300 students each year.
- COPAC is planning to host an online digital literacy education event later this year.
- COPAC is planning to host a PAC 101 event as there are quite a few PACs in the district who are struggling this year.
- BCCPAC AGM is May 4/5. Since we have membership this year and no plans to send anyone, we can sign our proxy vote to the COPAC President and COPAC Vice President to vote on our behalf. Resolutions that will be reviewed at the AGM will be sent out to members once they are ready and we can review them prior to agreeing to give COPAC our proxy.
- Last week the policy committee met to review policy 703 whether to allow SD staff to hold voting positions on PACs. Survey results had mixed opinions in favor or not in favor. Will give further update once the COPAC informs the reps of the outcome.



Are you interested in ordering prints next year? If YES, what is your approx. budget per child?



On a scale of 1-5 please rate the following item: Student image quality 29 responses








I am so unbelievably disappointed with the school photos this year!!!!!!! While it seemed like it was going to be better to have more photos selections, and print options. The overall cost was double, and the quality was garbage, most of the selection was just repeats. The images that I paid for were supposed to be edited, they were not. It was extremely confusing, I thought I downloaded the images when I was ordering my photos (like in past years). Until I got my daughters report card, which had last years photo, so I don't even know if my daughter is going to be in the yearbook Which I'm very unhappy about! I choose 5 different poses, with different photos sizes, they didn't zoom in on my daughter, so the pictures are mainly the background. School photos are supposed to be a close up of our children, so we can clearly see the changes and growth. I know other schools have had fundraisers that had photographer packages for family photos, this could be a good option for that, but as for school photos it's a hard No.

Did not love the white background/ shadowing. Wish for multiple children there was same set up to have similar side by sides. Seemed different distances away in each of their sets..

While I loved the extras, like the grad picture and the sibling shots, I found the interactions with the studio to be less than friendly. The prices, once you added your package together, were extremely high. The ordering process was clunky. I keep trying to remember other details, because I wanted to speak to them. Overall, while the pictures were cute, I'm not sure I'd be interested in supporting this studio again...:/

### Surprising find:

Did your students have sibling photos taken? IF YES did you order digital or print copies? Out of 8 who had them taken, only 5 purchased. Photographers said this was a really low revenue stream.
